Our speaker for February, Black History Month, will be Marva Wisdom, whose talk is entitled "Securing our Collective Heritage". Inspired by the Underground Railroad as a living history, Heritage Hall, at 83 Essex Street in downtown Guelph, stands as a metaphor of cultural self-determination that can be shared with immigrant and culturally diverse peoples living in Guelph. Today the Guelph Black Heritage Society preserves the historical significance of this important building by creating a cultural, historical, and social centre within Guelph and Wellington County.

Marva Wisdom, M.A. (Leadership) is a Senior Fellow at Munk School of Global Affairs & Public Policy (U of T) and a Fellow of the Environics Institute for Survey Research. She is a senior equity, inclusion and leadership practitioner, keynote speaker, researcher, and the City of Guelph’s external lead advisor with a goal to set the community standard for eliminating systemic racism. Marva is also one of the founding members and director of outreach for the well-received Black Experience research project – a 7-year study, led by Environics Institute and partners, and she directs Musagetes Foundation’s international Arts Everywhere Festival.

Marva, through her company Wisdom Consulting, continues to provide her

clients - local, national, and international, the support that they need to build leadership capacity for immersive equity and inclusion.

Her more than 30-plus years of volunteerism, include: Rotary Club member; past Canadian Museum for Human Rights campaign cabinet member, past 15-year YMCA/YWCA engaged leader, co-chair of 2003 & 2006 federal election policy platforms and current member of the Black Canadian Fundraisers Collective and Operation Black Vote Canada Advisory, to name a few.

Among her many recognitions is the Queen's Diamond Jubilee medal, the YWCA's Woman of Distinction award, Guelph Police and Toronto Police Services Leadership award, and University of Guelph's Lang Business College's Alumni with Impact Award, where she earned a Master of Arts in Leadership.
